

A weekend of events around the village, saw hundreds of people visit the Flower Festival in St. John's Church. There were 16 arrangements, all vastly different but with a celebration theme and the church smelled wonderful. (They'd even cleaned the windows)

Some of us had never done anything like it before and given that I had asked all the arrangers personally if they would do something, I was amazed. I didn't know my friends were so talented. The church looked wonderful and the event far exceeded my expectations.

The Children's Art Exhibition in the Age Concern and history a exhibition in the Sea Scouts were also open all weekend and they both had a steady stream of visitors.

The Village Show on Saturday was a really enjoyable event and the children loved it. Vegetable animals are my favourite and miniature gardens. Brings back memories for us all. My thanks to Sarah Jones and her team. The PTA Cake stall outside the hall did very well, as did the WI Cake sale at St John's in the morning as they sold out in no time, so Southbourne obviously has a sweet tooth.

After the interval two soloists, Rachel Hogarth a Bourne CC pupil, and Rebecca Cooke, mezzo-soprano performed. The Bourne CC Choir and Southbourne Community Choir then joined forces to sing Rule Britannia lead by Rebecca Cooke, Land of Hope and Glory and Jerusalem. A really rousing event and one that will probably be repeated as we all enjoyed it so much. Our thanks to Don Lloyd for organising the event.

Tuppenny Barn Organics Open Afternoon, was another success. Lots of people walked or cycled and when I drove there, (sorry) there was a steady stream of pedestrians heading that way. A lovely sunny afternoon, and a very pleasant opportunity to stroll around the smallholding and have a cream tea. A lot came to see the progress of the Sustainable Education Centre build, which now, almost, has an entire roof. I first came across Tuppenny Barn 5 years ago when I accompanied the Infant School pupils on a visit and they made paper flower pots and planted peas. That visit convinced me that Tuppenny Barn was an asset that we should be proud of.




