

From an idea started in Australia, Men's Shed came to Southbourne in 2013.

Finding suitable premises proved difficult and they ended up converting the old school cloakrooms and office to accommodate a social area, workroom and tools store. This doesn't give them a lot of space and they extended into a shed and then another shed in 2023.

The hope is to one day have their own premises, with enough room to have a good sized workshop, kitchen and social area.

We can only dream.

The humble shed is often considered the domain of men. STEPHEN PICKTHALL pays a visit to a group where this is quite literally true.

phenomenon which has been sweeping the country is very quietly taking place in Southbourne.

Entry is free and open to anyone – just as long as you're a man!

There is a place where some of the village's mostly retired men gather to share hobbies and interests while enjoying a chat and a joke twice a week.

And they are part of an international movement which is growing and growing.

The Men's Shed has been open for just over a year and it has been such an enjoyable experience for those involved that they are looking to expand.

"It all started about two years ago by a group of members from St John's Church who realised there seemed to be a lot going on for women but not much for men," said on of the founding members Geoff Collett.

"We thought we should probably change that and as word got out in the community, Age Concern contacted us and came up with the very generous offer that we could use its facilities at its New Road Centre.

"We spent about six

months renovating it because it was a bit of a tip; being the old cloakroom of a school there were wash basins and coat hangers which had to be removed. A lot of work was done so we didn't open to the wider public until September last year."

Most of the 18 registered members are retired and gather at the shed on Tuesday and Thursday mornings to enjoy the relaxed and friendly environment.

Among them is John Smith, who is often busy repairing old school textbooks which he sends out to Uganda.

"They are not always in

the best condition but the children there don't have anything so it's better then nothing," said John, who also helped set up a new school in the impoverished country in January.

"I've been doing it for 12 years and have probably sent about 1,450 boxes – that's about 15 tonnes."

The men have a variety of skills and interests and all the tools and equipment in the shed has come from donations.

They have made a number of board games for local charities and have also undertaken a number of local community projects, such as filling in a pond and turning it into a seating

area at Bourne Community College, erecting a shed for a disabled couple in the village and re upholstering chairs for the church.

"Once you're retired one of the major problems is social isolation, especially for older men," said member Alan McNeil.

"Men are not always the best at talking but here we come along to share different skills and interests and just enjoy ourself.

"There's no rules and regulations, it's all very relaxed and we're just trying to encourage our local community to do things together because there's not much else on offer elsewhere."

# A little sanctuary

The saplings, provided by the Woodland Trust, will be nurtured until sites around the village are available for planting. This is a very long term project for the village, but we have to start somewhere and this was it.

An event put on at St Johns Church by the SPNP Environment Group which was a focus group within the Southbourne Parish Neighbourhood Plan 2013 to 2015.

We had already planted a tree nursery at the recreation ground and held a couple of events to promote the Green Ring.

This greening event was well attended by Mens Shed and other locals and our Chichester Wildlife Office Sarah Hughes.

#### **Southbourne Commemorates**

Individual engraved stones to represent the 68 men in WW1 and 20 in WW2 that died will be laid around the memorial Cross in St. John's Church garden in late summer. The Cross was given by an unknown donor and consecrated on 6th January 1921. This is a community project and the stones are being funded by local groups and residents.

Connecting Southbourne, (now SCA) are responsible for the fundraising, and asked Men's Shed to make poppies to sell.

A lot of banging could be heard and we are pleased to tell you that 200 poppies were made using aluminium donated by local businesses T&C Precision and Metspin.

We thank them for this fantastic effort and as they reported in The Village Magazine they are available from Men's Shed, New Road and at other events from March.

A limited issue of 200, so on a first come basis.

Bourne College Students have also made items to sell so they will be at the Sussex Day Fete on 16th June.

Donations for the stones have been received from various groups and individuals but we need a total of £4k to complete the project so more fundraising needed.

Our thanks to Men's Shed and to T & C Precision, Manor Road who donated the aluminium.

Our Southbourne War Memorial, a simple concrete cross on a plinth, was given by an unknown donor and erected in the garden of St. John's Church in January 1921. 68 residents died in WW1 between 28<sup>th</sup> July 1914 and 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918 and 20 in WW2 between 1<sup>st</sup> Sept. 1939 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Sept. 1945.

For 2018 we are having engraved stones for each individual and Connecting Southbourne are organising the fundraising.


